Tower of London

The Prison

- The tower wasn't initially built as a prison, however between 1100 and 1952 hundreds of people were sent to prison here.
- Some of the famous prisoners include:
 1. Princess Elizabeth (1533-1603). She was imprisoned by her half sister, on suspicion of plotting against her.
 2. Lady Jane Grey (1537-1554). She became the queen of England but became a prisoner a few days later.
 3. Guy Fawkes (1570-1606). On the 5th of November he was found with several barrels of gunpowder.
